#### ANNUAL MEETING OF THE SOCIETY

The Society's Eighth Annual Meeting was held on Thursday, November 7, 1974, at Hotel Statler Hilton in Boston (Massachusetts). Our panels on "Literature and Society in Iran" and "The Role of Women in Iran" were well attended and extremely successful. On behalf of the Society, I would like to thank our program director, Professor William Beeman, for organizing these two panels. I would also like to thank all those who delivered papers and participated in our panels.

The annual business meeting was held in the late afternoon. The following reports were submitted by the Society's officers. (These reports have been updated to include the period since the meeting in November.)

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY (Farhad Kazemi) (The report was delivered by the Acting Executive Secretary, Ervand Abrahamian.)

Membership. The Society has continued to increase its members in the past year. The Society now has 247 members. This is an increase of 36 during the past year. In addition to our members, some 50 individuals and over 120 institutions subscribe to our journal.

Our international membership has also continued to increase. Fifty-four of our members live outside the United States: 32 in Iran, 5 in Japan, 5 in England, and the others in such diverse places as France, Denmark, Sweden, Switzerland, Egypt, Afghanestan, Australia, and the Fiji Islands.

As the following table indicates, most of the members are in the academic disciplines of History, Near Eastern Languages and Literatures, Linguistics, Political Science, and Economics. The disciplines not identified in the table are mostly in the physical sciences or medicine.

# REPORT OF THE TREASURER (Ann Schulz)

The Society's financial situation continued to improve in 1974, despite the increased costs of publishing the Journal. This is due to several factors—increased donation levels, journal sales, and the continued support of the membership.

Donations formed a substantial proportion of the Society's budget during the last year. They were received from individuals as well as institutions. As some of the members may know, the Society received an institutional contribution of \$500.00 from the University of Texas in 1974 (and has also received similar support from Princeton University in 1975). These grants have been extremely helpful and the Society's gratitude has been conveyed to both universities. Professor Gene Garthwaite of Dartmouth College spent many hours contacting various Middle East Centers throughout the United States, seeking support for the Society. Our appreciation is conveyed to him as well.

Professor Vahid Nowshirvani has actively and successfully sought financial support for the Society in Iran during the past year. Both Professors Nowshirvani and Garthwaite are filling a need which the Society has had for a number of years—someone willing to make the commitment to fund-raising.

The journal sales have increased and will continue to do so as the Isfahan issues are available. As you can see in the Balance Sheet, the Society was responsible for only \$500.00 of the total cost of the two issues. The remaining (app.) \$10,000 was underwritten by the Fogg Museum at Harvard. It has been a year of much cooperative effort and tremendously helpful to the Society.

## REPORT OF THE EDITOR OF IRANIAN STUDIES (Ali Banuazizi)

The past year (1974) was one of unprecedented growth for the Journal. With the publication of five issues (Vol. VI, No. 4; Vol. VII, Nos. 1-4), we were finally able to eliminate a long-standing lag in our publishing schedule and to go on a regular schedule as of winter, 1975.

The appearance of the proceedings of the Fogg Museum's international colloquium on Isfahan as a special, 750-page volume was a significant achievement for the Journal. This was made possible through the kind and active support of Professor Oleg Grabar, the primary organizer of the conference at Harvard, the tireless and skilfull work of Renata Holod as the guest editor of the volume, and the generous financial support of the Fogg Art Museum which subsidized the publication. It is our hope that similar volumes of conference proceedings or issues devoted entirely to one topic could be published in the near future. And, in fact, plans for two such volumes are already underway.

With the forthcoming issue of the Journal (winter, 1975), Ms. Anna Enayat will join us as Associate Editor. A former editor of Iran's only English-language journal in economics, <u>Tahqiqat-e Eqtesadi</u>, Ms. Enayat is currently a member of the Faculty of Economics at the University of Tehran and an active researcher in the fields of economics and sociology. Situated in Tehran and in touch with a wide segment of the Iranian social-science community, she is certain to be able to widen the base of the Journal by helping to increase its readership and solicit contributions from Iranian scholars.

A. Reza Sheikholeslami, whose work as Associate Editor over the past two years has been invaluable to the Journal and whose rigorous and high standards have helped to improve its quality, will no longer hold that position. He will, however, continue to maintain a close working relationship with us. The Journal and the Society are indebted to him for his many contributions.

No one could have been more pleased with Jerry Clinton's return to the United States to accept a position at Princeton last fall than I was. His proximity to the production line would enhance his substantial contribution to all editorial matters once again.

Last but not least, I would like to take this opportunity to express my special gratitude to many individuals who generously advised and assisted me in the work of the Journal over the past year. Among them I feel especially indebted to Ervand Abrahamian, Marina Banuazizi, Gene Garthwaite, Vahid Nowshirvani, and Marvin Zonis.
