I was born in 1949 in Teheran/Iran. My father, Seyyed Mohammad Vali, was a civil servant in parliament (mağles šorāye mellī). My mother, Fatima Salari, was a housewife. From 1956 till 1968 I attend school and after one year in college, I became a teacher. Parallel to my work, I studied English translation. My B.A. was about "Confession of a teacher", which I translated from Persian to English. From 1975 till 1977 I studied Old and Middle Iranian languages and cultures in Pažūheškade-ye Farhang-e Iran. My teachers were Prof. Parwiz Natel Khanlari, Prof. Mehrdad-e Bahar, Prof. Badri Gharib and Prof. Abulghassemi. My M.A. was an edition and translation (to Modern Persian) of Kārnāmak-e Artaxšer Pāpakān. From November 1978 I was sent to Berlin by scholarship in order to specialize in Semitic studies and research about Middle Iranian logograms. In 1986 I finished my studies with Ph.D. about the semantic development of Arabic words in the Persian language with Prof. Rudolf Macuch.
