Annual Business Meeting

The Society's Fourth Annual Business Meeting will be held at the Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio, on November 6 or 7, 1970, concurrently with the Fourth Annual Business Meeting of the Middle East Studies Association (MESA).

The new Council is proposing that the election of the Council for 1971 be held by mail prior to our Annual Business Meeting. The values of this arrangement are several: in view of the overlap in our membership with MESA this should be the most convenient time for all; if the Business Meeting fails to achieve a quorum, decisions could be made by the old and the new Councils in consultation with an informal meeting of the members present; and finally, responsabilities could be more easily transferred from the old to the new Council at this time.

Proposed Constitutional Amendment

To make the above procedure possible, the Council is proposing the following amendment to the Constitution:

Article VI, Section I. The seven members of the Council shall be chosen by a majority vote of the members of the Society through mail balloting prior to the Annual Business Meeting. The Secretary and the Treasurer shall be chosen by a majority vote of the Council from among its own members. The President shall be chosen from among the Society's members to serve for no more than one year at a time, and to act as the ex-officio chairman of the Council.

The Article, as it now stands, reads as follows:

Article VI, Section I. The seven members of the Council shall be chosen by a majority vote of the members of the Society attending the Annual Business Meeting, a quorum being present. The President, Secretary, and Treasurer shall be chosen by a majority vote of the Council from among its own members.

In order to act on this as soon as possible, the Council has decided to put it to a vote through the mail. Would you kindly send in your vote in the enclosed ballot? It takes a two-thirds majority of the Society's membership for the amendment to pass. We urge you therefore to send in your vote today!
